Classical Literature

International Hahnemannian Association Transactions

WholeHealthNow is proud to present an almost complete collection of the published Transactions of the International Hahnemannian Association (IHA). The collection contains 36 complete years from this essential record of some of the best homeopathy that has ever been practiced.

This new anthology, now available for Encyclopedia Homeopathica (EH), is a treasure trove of homeopathic knowledge distilled from the clinical experience of the some of the greatest homeopathic practitioners who have ever lived.

Full of cases, materia medica, philosophy, thoughtful discussion and practical application, these transactions showcase this rare material for the benefit of modern homeopaths. Through these transactions you will rediscover the miracle of homeopathy in treating acute and chronic disease. With the sophisticated power and masterful precision of EH's search functions, this information is accessible as never before.

By the last quarter of the 19th century, the American Institute of Homeopathy had 'proved' that the 30th potency was only placebo and its members were no longer required to be homeopaths. Hundreds of 'homeopaths' were graduating from homeopathic colleges with little more than a therapeutic, pathological brand of allopathic homeopathy.

The IHA was founded in 1880 by a group of steadfast Hahnemannian homeopaths including A. Lippe, P. P. Wells, and H. C. Allen. Formed as a reaction against the preponderance of poor homeopathy that was being practiced, the IHA identified itself with the *Organon*, the law of similars, the single remedy, and the minimum dose.

In the words of P. P. Wells, it was "[Homœopathy, as contained in these principles, which the Association pledged itself to illustrate and defend.](#)" These *IHA Transactions* also contain all the presentations made at the yearly meetings of the Association. They were printed as the *IHA transactions* until 1926 after which they were printed in *The Homeopathic Recorder*.

Julian Winston from his *The Heritage of Homeopathic Literature* is quoted as saying,

"Where would homeopathy be without these? A full record of the thinking of the greatest homeopaths of the time. Always 'Hahnemanian' in its outlook, the papers printed were often followed by discussions which followed the presentations, and it is in these discussions that off-the-cuff remarks are made by stalwarts such as Kent, Boger, Fincke, Case, Close and others."

The *IHA Transactions*, by themselves, would be enough reason to make having access to these materials mandatory for anyone aspiring towards good homeopathy, but we have included still a great bit more.

▪ **The Homeopathic Physician**

Another addition included in EH package K is a collection of issues from *The Homeopathic Physician*, the official organ for the International Hahnemannian Association. The new package contains seven complete years. Published from 1881-1899 this journal was committed to "Hahnemannian Homeopathy." At the top of every volume was the following quote by Constantine Hering:

"If our school ever gives up the strict inductive method of Hahnemann, we are lost, and deserve to be mentioned only as a caricature, in the history of medicine."

The journal was edited by E. J. Lee, MD, and then Walter James, MD, and finally G. H. Clark, MD. During its 19 years of publication, it printed a number of invaluable small repertories.

There is a wealth of information including all the fine papers, cases, and discussions of Bayard, Wells, Lippe, Boger, Kent, Lilienthal, E.E. Case and other members of the IHA, in

addition to many “Hahnemannian” docs who were unaffiliated with the IHA. Some were still AIH members; some chose not to become officially affiliated with the IHA , but still submitted papers periodically.

Julian Winston from his *The Heritage of Homeopathic Literature* states that it was, “An invaluable resource. Always Hahnemannian in outlook and approach. There are very few collections that include all the volumes.”

▪ **Medical Advance**

The Advance began in March of 1873 as the *Cincinnati Medical Advance*, edited by T. P. Wilson. In 1882 the journal moved to Ann Arbor and became the *Ann Arbor Medical Advance*.

The following year it was published in Chicago after which it returned to Ann Arbor in 1884 under the editorship of Henry Clay Allen. In 1893 the journal was sold to H. W. Pierson who continued editing it until 1895 when H. C. Allen claimed ownership, forcing Pierson to relinquish his rights.

The mysterious disappearance of the publisher, Dr. John Rice Miner, gave Dr. Allen a chance to seize control, but Pierson continued publishing while pursuing litigation in the matter. The November issue of 1895 had a blank masthead, which in the December issue was replaced with the title of *The Hahnemannian Advocate*, remaining pretty much intact and carrying the same volume #s.

The Advocate was published until the end of 1902. H. C. Allen began publishing *The Advance* again in 1901 continuing until his death in 1909. After that, his co-editor, J. B. S. King continued its publication until 1915. In 1904, Kent’s *Journal of Homeopathics* was merged with *The Advance*. Under Allen’s adept editorship, the journal became even more “Hahnemannian” in its approach.

King, who had been an assistant editor under Dr. Allen continued the “Hahnemannian” influence until the end. King himself was an advocate for pure homeopathy and had been the president of the International Hahnemannian Association in 1913.

In 1902, H. C. Allen stated that, “This journal is devoted entirely to the perpetuation and an aggressive struggle for pure homeopathy.”

Inside the pages of this journal is contained the insights of Wells, Lippe, Fincke, Close, Kent, E. E. Case, Berridge, et al. Presented papers with discussions from “pure” societies such as the Lippe Society, the Organon Society, the Brooklyn Hahnemannian Union and the Central NY Society were notable features.

Another highlight was James Tyler Kent’s illuminating classroom talks, lectures on the *Organon* and numerous materia medica lectures, differing from those published as his official *Lectures on Homeopathic Materia Medica*.

There are also many small repertories which were first published in *The Advance*. Along with *The Organon Journal*, *The Homeopathic Physician* and *The Homeopathic Recorder*, *The Advance* was one of the few publications which focused on pure homeopathy through cases, principles and provings.

- **The Homeopathic Recorder**

The Homeopathic Recorder was a bi-monthly journal published by Boericke and Tafel from 1886 through 1959. This collection contains a few thousand pages of complete volumes from the late 1800s. In 1927 the journal was assumed by the International Hahnemannian Association and became its official publication.

During its long history it remained dedicated to the highest standards and offers some of the most valuable and important information in any of the journals we are making available.

Julian Winston in *The Heritage of Homeopathic Literature* writes: "The only record of pure homeopathy through homeopathy's lean years. Papers by Roberts, Dixon, Hayes, Grimmer, Green, Wright-Hubbard, Whitmont and others. Buried within is a column called Carriwidgits - which is filled with all kinds of practical advice. A very valuable resource."

- **The Homeopathician – A Journal of Pure Homeopathy**

This short-lived but invaluable journal was edited by James Tyler Kent MD and Julia Loos, MD. It included much of Kent's later writings.

Originally published bi-monthly, it eventually became a 100 page quarterly in 1916. After the death of Kent, two final issues were published after which the journal ceased publication. EH package K contains the complete copies of the first three volumes.

- **Journal of Homeopathic Clinics**

Edited by Constantine Hering and Henry Noah Martin, this valuable journal was published for only nine years. However, during that period of time some of the most original ideas in homeopathy were published within its pages.

H. N. Guernsey published his article entitled "Lectures on Key-Notes", where this term was first introduced. It was also within these pages that E. A. Farrington published his supplement to *Gross's Materia Medica*.

Each issue was always full of interesting and instructive cases. Volumes 1 and 2 were bound together in 1869 as the *Journal of Homeopathic Clinics*. This title was kept through volume 4 after which it became the *American Journal of Materia Medica and Record of Medical Science*.

Volume 1 and 2 are available as part of the Herscu Package for EH. EH Package K contains volumes 3 and 4.

- **Monthly Journal of Homeopathy**

A popular British journal of the 1840s and 50s. It began in 1846 as the *Journal of Health and Disease* and was published with that name until 1850 at which time it changed its name to the *Monthly Journal of Homeopathy*. It provides a fascinating glimpse into the early history of homeopathy in Great Britain. We are including three complete volumes.

- **Homeopathy and Homeopathic Prescribing**

by *Harvey Farrington*

Published in 1955, this collection of 43 lessons was the primary instruction book in the American Foundation for Homeopathy Post-graduate Courses. Lessons six through 42 focus on materia medica whereas lesson 43 looks at how to use the repertory.

There is a unique and extremely useful description of the chronic picture of Ferrum phosphoricum as well as other reliable information not found anywhere else.

- **American Institute of Homeopathy Transactions**

A record of the annual meetings conducted by the longest standing homeopathic organization in the United States.

Julian Winston, in describing these transactions, writes that they were, “Filled with historical information and fascinating cases. The earlier volumes are most interesting in terms of ‘Hahnemannian’ Homeopathy.”

By 1870 Dunham had suggested the “opening” of the organization and by 1880 very little pure homeopathy was discussed within its pages. However, these journals do contain some interesting information and are valuable as part of the historical record of the state of homeopathy during these years.

- **Transactions of the Homeopathic Medical Society of New York**

Included in the new package are six years of the *Transactions of the Homeopathic Medical Society of the State of New York*.

Running from 1906 through 1912, these transactions provide a glimpse of the state of homeopathy during the early 1900s. There are also many valuable cases, articles and materia medica descriptions. One can get a sense of how these homeopaths were trying to reconcile modern advances in medicine and science with the principles laid out in the *Organon*.

- **Medical Dictionary of Principal Words used in Medicine**

We have included a medical dictionary from the late 1800s. With this valuable resource, you will be able to find any unusual medical term found in our repertories or the old literature. It can help you understand the original definition of terms which have changed meaning in the last few hundreds years.

This 1000 page dictionary will increase your ability to utilize the full extent of our homeopathic heritage.

- **Plain Talks on Materia Medica**

by *Willard Ide Pierce*

Published by Boericke and Tafel, this 792 page book on comparative materia medica was based on lectures presented by the author at the New York Homeopathic Medical College between 1898 and 1908.

One reviewer of the time said, “It is the best thing since Farrington’s *Clinical Materia Medica* appeared.”

The real value of the book is in its comparison of characteristic symptoms of one remedy to other remedies which share that symptom. Even though few homeopaths are familiar with this title, this is one of the best comparative materia medica’s in our literature.

The remedy section provides valuable information about the sources of the remedy, a description of its preparation and detailed information about how it was proved.

- **Homeopathic Bibliography of the United States**

by Thomas Lindsley Bradford

This delightful book by homeopathy’s greatest historian contains a complete listing of all books, pamphlets, addresses, lectures ever published as well as all the journals, publishers and libraries in the United States at that time.

It also contains a complete record of hospitals, sanitariums, schools, societies, pharmacies and dispensaries in the U.S. Many of the titles have a brief description as well as the date of publication, author, publisher, etc.

The 550 pages contained in this publication are jammed full of interesting articles, cases and practical tips on the application of homeopathy in this area of medicine.

- **Additions to the Materia Medica Pura by Johann Ernst Stapf**

This 292 page collection of 12 provings includes Clematis, Coffea, Crocus, Juniperus, Ranunculus bulbosus, Ranunculus scleratus, Rhododendron, Sabadilla, Senega, Teucrium, Valeriana, Vitex agnus castus.

Stapf was an original member of the Prover’s Union and these early provings capture the spirit of homeopathy in its beginning.

- **Chronic Miasms: Sycosis**

by James Henry Allen

This 426 page volume on miasms compliments the author's other work on the subject; *The Chronic Miasms: Psora and Pseudo Psora*. Julian Winston in his *The Heritage of Homeopathic Literature* describes this title as, "A very in-depth discussion of the theoretical side of the miasms by J. H. Allen who taught the subject in Chicago at the Hering College. Allen wrote a third volume on Syphilis, but died before it was published. It was to be serialized in one of the journals, but only one piece ever saw publication."

Contemporary Literature

- **The New England Journal of Homeopathy**

EH package K includes every volume of the *New England Journal of Homeopathy* from 1992 through 2001.

Remedies described in this way include Anacardium, Aurum, Bothrops, Bufo, Carcinosis, Cenchris, Conium, Dulcamara, Hyoscyamus, Kali carbonicum, Lachesis, Mancinella, Mercurius, Phosphorus, Stramonium, Tarentula hispanica, Thuja, Vipera, Zicum metallicum and more.

There are also numerous cases, historical and philosophical musings and discussions on the practical application of homeopathy for a number of different disease conditions.

- **The Homeopathic Treatment of Eczema**

by Robin Logan FSHom

The author discusses techniques of case-taking and analysis he has used to treat eczema and discusses details of treatment and the materia medica of several important remedies, bringing it all together through specific examples from 22 cured cases.

Logan begins by defining the condition by reference to its conventional treatment, since most patients will have taken this route first and are likely to be familiar with the terminology of their diagnosis and the pharmaceutical preparations they have received.

He then describes techniques of case-taking that are particularly appropriate to eczema. This is followed by a full discussion of case analysis, including the relevance of particulars in the hierarchy of symptoms and the subject of one-sided cases, or cases with few other symptoms, with a view to helping the reader to increase his or her own understanding of the issues involved. Further chapters cover all aspects of case management, among them

suppression, aggravation, potency, repetition of the dose, adjunctive measures and commonsense advice.
